Q: I've never done this before? What exactly is involved?

A: Judging is an excellent way to learn all about what DECA has to offer and to see our future leaders at work! Judging involves reading a case study or business plan and listening to participants' solutions to the case study or present their business plan.

Q: How do I judge the students?

A: You will see an about 18-20 students throughout the day. After each presentation, you will evaluate the participant using a given rubric based on industry-validated performance indicators.

Q: How long will this take?

A: Your commitment is required from approximately 8:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. The timing may change slightly depending on the number of students who are in attendance and the category in which you are judging.

Q: Will I need to bring my own lunch or pay for my own parking?

A: A light breakfast (including coffee & tea) and lunch is always included as a part of your day! Unfortunately, DECA Ontario does **not** cover parking costs or mileage.
